






Area 3: I-275 Overpass



- Target / Walmart


4. Would you visit Franklin Street businesses or events more frequently if there was a nearby streetcar route?


5. In general, do you feel safe when you are walking along Franklin Street?




7. In general, do you feel safe when you are biking along Franklin Street?










